What is Periodic Reporting?




- Global conservation monitoring activity
- Statutory requirement of the World Heritage Convention (Article 29)
- Self reporting on the implementation of the World Heritage Convention at national level and property level

Purposes

- Assessing the application of the World Heritage Convention by country
- Assessing whether Outstanding Universal Value is being maintained
- Helping update information on properties and record changing circumstances
- Encouraging regional cooperation and networking

REPORTING IN REGIONS

National Focal Points complete the state-level report (**Section** I) while reports for each World Heritage property in the region (**Section II**) are completed by site Managers

SUBMISSION

Reports are sent to the World Heritage Centre and Regional Reports are developed

REGIONAL REPORTS

are examined by the World Heritage Committee and recommendations are formulated

REGIONAL ACTION PLANS

are formulated setting strategies, priorities and goals for implementation of the World Heritage Convention

Periodic Reporting is carried out on a region by region basis




- Promotes cooperation in the regions




Online Questionnaire

Periodic Reports are compiled from information collected through an online questionnaire which consists of two sections:

Section I (national level)

Section II (property level)


Regional Reports

- → information on conservation of World Heritage in a region and the main challenges faced
- → trends related to regional or global phenomena
 - information on World Heritage conservation in a region and the main challenges
 - trends related to regional/subregional phenomena

Regional Action Plans

- → tool for setting regional priorities for implementing the World Heritage Convention
- → a way of interpreting and translating the Periodic Reporting data into concrete outcomes following a set timeline.
- formulated through a collaborative process that can involve national Focal Points, Site Managers, Advisory Bodies and the World Heritage Centre.
- a user-generated tool that incorporates the specific needs of Site Managers and States Parties

Outcomes of the report (for Europe)

Main factors affecting the WH properties

- built environment (housing/transportation)
- tourism / visitor / recreational activities
- climate change-related factors (humidity, natural hazards)

Management

• 60% of WH properties had a Management System or a Management Plan



Outcomes of the report (for Europe)

Capacity building needs


- developing World Heritage-targeted monitoring indicators
- developing partnership models
- enhancing community-based research
- developing site-specific benefit sharing mechanisms

Implementing WH Committee recommendations

A minority of the recommendations have been fully implemented.



Outcomes of the report (for Europe)







Overall conclusion

- The state of conservation is rated as good in the region and the OUV of WH properties as maintained.
- National Focal Points and Site Managers considered that the Periodic Reporting was useful.




Action Plan (fir Europe)

HELSINKI ACTION PLAN

Core objectives:

- Identification and protection of OUV
- Effective management of WH properties
- 3) Increased awareness of the Convention
- Identified 34 actions
- Targets were expected to be reached by the end of the Third Cycle of Periodic Reporting (2024)

In Europe and North America

Management Plans

2015: 136 out of 480 WH properties submitted a Management Plan to the WHC (28%)

2022: 220 out of 547 WH properties have a Management Plan available on the WHC website (40,22%)

Retrospective SOUVs

2015: Out of the 368 missing RSOUVs, 201 had been adopted by the WH Committee

2022: No missing RSOUV for NA, 29 is still missing in EUR or pending approval by the WH Committee




→ Monitoring Indicators and Analytical Framework

- Developed within the framework of the Periodic Reporting Reflection Period (2015-2017)
- To improve the presentation of data for enhanced accessibility and usability, allowing States Parties to use it more effectively for their own monitoring activities
- Based on the six core thematic areas of the Periodic Reports.
- Indicators to measure trends and developments in World Heritage conservation.
- A global template for the analysis of data in all regions



- Applicable to all regions and sites











Video tutorials






- A capacity-building tool for Periodic Reporting
